Michael Callaghan, the angry young artist who gave us the iconic slogan "If the unemployed are dole bludgers ... what the f--- are the idle rich?", might be older but he's no less angry. In his first commercial gallery show in 30 years, the founder of the legendary poster workshop Redback Graphix lets loose on the Iraq war. Callaghan made the show, which draws on the catchphrases of war, as the ANU's H.C. Coombs Creative Arts Fellow, thus following in the footsteps of Sidney Nolan and Arthur Boyd.
